

omen are integral to the prosperity and well-being of families, communities, nations, and humanity as a whole. International Women's Day serves as an opportunity to honor their unique contributions to social and economic progress. While this day often centers around discussions on women's empowerment and the challenges they face in both personal and professional spheres, I believe these conversations should not be confined to a single day. Instead, there should be an ongoing dialogue throughout the year to evaluate our progress toward gender equality and implement necessary measures to close the gender gap.

I commend the Reserve Bank of India for selecting "Financial Literacy: Women's Prosperity" as the theme for this year's Financial Literacy Week. This highlights the crucial role of financial education in ensuring women's economic independence and security. Industry associations can also contribute by organizing financial literacy initiatives specifically for women, raising awareness about credit, investment, insurance, and pension options tailored for women professionals and entrepreneurs. Additionally, I urge both central and state governments to introduce dedicated industrial policies for women, providing them with essential support such as land, access to capital, technology, and other resources to help establish and expand their businesses.



As an industrialist and economic expert, I firmly believe that women will be at the forefront of India's next wave of economic growth. The days when their roles were confined to household chores or limited to small-scale activities like jewelry making, baking, or tailoring in their spare time are long past. Today, women are the driving force behind sustainable development. It is inspiring to see Indian women excelling in diverse fields such as aerospace, defense, science, technology, research & development, sports, bureaucracy, and public administration. Notably, women make up about 15% of India's pilot workforce—significantly higher than the global average of 4%. In recent years, they have played a vital role in India's space missions, and approximately 16% of scientists in the country's R&D institutions are women. A private survey also reveals that women constitute 20% of the manufacturing workforce, with an impressive 80% representation in the rapidly expanding electronics sector.

While these figures indicate significant progress toward gender diversity across various sectors, there is still much work to be done, particularly in bridging the gender gap in entrepreneurship. India is home to over two crore Udyami-registered womenowned enterprises, in addition to numerous women entrepreneurs operating in the informal sector. However, many of these entrepreneurs face challenges in scaling their businesses due to limited access to capital, professional incubation, and acceleration support. The key challenge lies in facilitating the growth and expansion of these informal women-led businesses and integrating them into the formal economy. Supporting their development will not only boost per capita income and employment but also generate increased tax revenue, benefiting the government and the overall economy.

The government's efforts to promote women entrepreneurship through financial inclusion, digital credit access, and simplified compliance processes are commendable. However, there is a pressing need for stronger collaboration between the private sector, industry associations, research institutions, and state governments, particularly in advancing women's entrepreneurship and skill development.

Women entrepreneurs require incubation and acceleration support to scale their businesses by expanding into new markets, strengthening branding, obtaining quality certifications, retaining customers, and exploring international opportunities. Many women-owned enterprises struggle to survive due to competitive pressures, payment defaults by buyers, limited access to technology, and the high cost of capital. It is crucial for state governments to actively engage with industry associations to revive struggling MSMEs, particularly women-led businesses, to foster regional economic growth and sustainable employment.

I extend my heartfelt congratulations to all the remarkable women featured in this publication for their outstanding contributions across business, sports, entertainment, arts, cuisine, public administration, and various other fields. On this International Women's Day, I warmly wish all women continued success and empowerment. I am confident that with collective efforts, we will soon bridge the gender gap across all sectors of the economy, bringing us closer to our vision of Viksit Bharat.

Rising from the Ashes: My Journey from Adversity to Global Entrepreneurship and Politics

ife has tested me in ways I never imagined, but every challenge has only strengthened my resolve. I have known loss, betrayal, and struggles that could have broken me. But I chose to rise. From fighting a

Breaking into the UK's business world was not easy. I faced scepticism, cultural barriers, and intense competition. I built networks, studied the market, and worked relentlessly to position myself as a key player in the UK-India trade corridor.

decade-long legal battle while raising two sons alone to building multiple businesses and now stepping into UK politics, my journey is one of resilience, reinvention, and sheer determination.

As I prepare for the Wandsworth Town Council election in May 2026, I reflect on my path, how I arrived in London in 2022, unknown and uncertain, and in just 2.5 years, established myself as a successful entrepreneur and a leader.

This is my story. Not just of Success, but of Survival.

Surviving the Storm: A Decade of Struggles and Reinvention

My first setback came early in life. I lost my husband in a car accident when I was just 23 years old-only 19 days after giving birth to my first son. In an instant, my world

shattered. I was a young widow, grieving and alone, yet I had a newborn to care for. I had no choice but to be strong.

Later, I remarried, hoping to rebuild a family, but instead, I found myself trapped in an abusive marriage. The years that followed were filled with pain, but I refused to let my circumstances define me. After enduring years of turmoil, I finally broke free, determined to reclaim my life.

For over ten years, my life was entangled in a relentless divorce litigation, a battle that drained me emotionally and financially. As a single mother, I had to fight not just for my rights but for the future of my two sons, Aarya and Shalin.

Society was quick to judge, quick to assume that a woman alone couldn't make it. But I was not ready to be defined by my circumstances.

This wasn't the first time life had knocked me down. I have restarted my life three times before finally building a thriving business.

Each time, I rebuilt my career, my identity, and my confidence. Like a phoenix, I rose from the ashesstronger, wiser, and more determined than before.

During this time, I found solace in my work. I channelised my pain into empowering other women. My self-defense journey became a purpose, not just a profession. I led some of India's largest self-defense campaigns, including the Nirbhaya Safety Drive, and trained Indian Army officers' wives, police commissioner's safety programs, remand homes, school students, and university young women, empowering more than 1 million girls and women. My mission was simple, to equip women with the confidence and skills to protect themselves.

Finding Strength in Art and Creativity

Alongside my advocacy for women's safety, I also found another creative outlet-the film industry. I had the privilege of working on several meaningful projects, directing short films and ad campaigns that told stories of

strength, resilience, and human connection. Each project was a piece of my soul, a way to express emotions that words often failed to capture.

But even with these achievements, I knew my journey was far from complete.

The Pandemic: A Turning Point toward Global Entrepreneurship

Lockdown was a time of uncertainty for the world, but for me, it was a moment of transformation. Instead of waiting for opportunities, I created them.

I saw the struggles of artisans in Indian villages, skilled craftsmen whose work deserved global recognition but remained confined to small communities. I decided to become a bridge between their artistry and the world. This was my entry into international trade.

I became a merchant exporter from India, introducing handcrafted treasures to global markets. With no prior experience in exports, I learned everything from scratch, studying trade regulations, understanding supply chains, and navigating international markets. It was overwhelm-

ing, but my passion to bring Indian craftsmanship to the world kept me going.

This step led to my next big venture, **Vighnaharta Ganesha**, **my eco-conscious brand**, which went from Mumbai to London and Auckland, becoming a symbol of sustainable devotion worldwide.

Building a Legacy in the UK: From Entrepreneur to Political Candidate

In 2022, I made a bold move. I arrived in London with nothing but a vision, to establish myself in the international business landscape. It was a fresh start, a chance to redefine my life on my own terms.

Within two years, I became the exclusive UK and Ireland Country Partner for Chitale Bandhu, one of India's most renowned food brands. I also made Vighnaharta Ganesha, a premium eco-friendly brand, setting a new standard in the industry.

Breaking into the UK's business world was not easy. I faced scepticism, cultural barriers, and intense competition. But I had spent a lifetime overcoming obstacles. I

built networks, studied the market, and worked relentlessly to position myself as a key player in the UK-India trade corridor.

Yet, my ambitions extended beyond business. I had always been drawn to public service, and soon, I found myselfimmersed in UK politics.

Making History in Wandsworth

I started my political journey as a women's officer and scaled up to be the Ward Chair Spokesperson for Roehampton, engaging with communities, helping local businesses, and addressing social challenges like youth crime and drug abuse.

My work caught the attention of key leaders, and with series of intense interviews and polling, I was selected as a Conservative Party candidate from Roehampton for Wandsworth Town Council's May 2026 election.

Wandsworth has a rich political history, Margaret Thatcher launched her leadership contest here, and the current London Mayor also hails from this borough. To be chosen as a candidate from such a historically significant area is an honour. It's not just a political achievement, it's a testament to how far I have come, representing my Indian roots in the heart of UK politics.

The Unwavering Support that kept me Going

Behind every strong woman is a support system that lifts her up when the weight of the world becomes too much to bear. For me, that foundation has been my **sons**, **Aarya and Shalin**. They have been my pillars of strength, my greatest cheerleaders, and my reason to keep pushing forward.

Alongside them, I have been fortunate to have incredible **mentors** who have guided me, challenged me, and believed in me even when I struggled to believe in myself. No one achieves success alone. I owe my journey to those who stood by me in the darkest times celebrated with me in the brightest moments.



Born into a naval defence family, my life took a pivotal turn when my father, an aviation specialist, was transferred to Goa in 1976. With his squadron based in this picturesque state, we made Goa our home. After earning my Master's degree in Sociology, I embarked on my career as a teacher. However, my specialization soon led me to an unexpected yet transformative opportunity in the development sector. 





rom the lush green fields of Dhing in Assam to the grand arenas of international athletics, my journey has been a tapestry woven with threads of passion, resilience, and unwavering support. Every triumph has been built on a foundation of hard work, perseverance, and the encouragement of those who have stood by me through every challenge.

My Journey, Their Belief

At the heart of my story stands my family, whose unwavering belief in me has been a constant source of strength. **My parents**, despite our modest means, nurtured my dreams with their sacrifices and encouragement. Equally pivotal have been my coaches, **Nipon Das** and **Nabajit Malakar**, who recognized my potential early on and transformed my raw talent into refined skill. Their combined support has been my anchor, especially during moments of self-doubt. Having such pillars to lean on has been invaluable in my journey as an athlete.

Defining Moments: My Journey to Glory

The year 2018 marked a turning point in my life. Competing at the **World U20 Championships** in **Tampere, Finland,** I clinched the **gold medal** in the **400**

meters, clocking a time of **51.46 seconds**. This victory was historic, as it was the first time an Indian woman secured a gold medal at a global track event.


Later that year, at the **Asian Games** in **Jakarta**, I achieved a silver medal in the **400 meters** and contributed to India's **gold** in both the **women's** and **mixed 4×400 meters relays.** During the 400 meters final, I set a **new national record** with a time of **50.79 seconds**.

In 2021, I was honored to be appointed as a **Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP) in Assam**, a role that allows me to serve my community and inspire others to pursue their dreams, both on and off the field.

Battling Setbacks, Rising Stronger

My journey from a small village in Assam to the international athletics stage has been filled with challenges. Despite my rise, I have faced several struggles, including financial difficulties, injuries, and career uncertainties.

 Early Life Struggles: Growing up in Dhing, Assam, in a humble farming family, resources were scarce. With no formal sports facilities in my village, I initially played football with boys on muddy fields before shifting to sprinting. Lack of proper training facilities and coaching meant I had to train under tough conditions. My family's financial struggles made it difficult to support my athletic ambitions, but their belief in me never wavered.

Injury Setbacks: After my breakthrough in 2018, I suffered from recurring back and hamstring injuries, significantly affecting my performance. These injuries forced me to withdraw from major events, including the 2019 World Championships and the Tokyo 2020 Olympics (held in 2021). Rehabilitation was a long

and difficult process, and it was mentally and physically exhausting to be away from the track for so long.

- Shift from 400m to 200m: Due to persistent injuries, I
 had to shift my focus from the 400m race to the
 200m sprint, as shorter distances put less strain on
 my body. This transition was challenging because it
 required adjusting my training, racing strategy, and
 competition mindset while striving to regain my top
 form.
- Financial and Training Struggles: In my early career, I
 trained under difficult conditions, without access to
 high-tech facilities, proper diet plans, or financial
 stability. Even after achieving national fame, I had to
 work hard to secure sponsorships and financial
 backing to continue my training.
- Career Uncertainty and Comeback Efforts: With injuries affecting my performance, I struggled to maintain my ranking and was unable to qualify for key international tournaments, including the Olympics. One of the biggest setbacks in my career came in July 2023, when I faced a 16-month ban due to a 'whereabouts' failure. Navigating this period required immense mental fortitude. With the unwavering support of my family, coach, and well-wishers, I focused on introspection, learning, and preparing for a stronger comeback. Despite these obstacles, I remain determined to return stronger and represent India on the global stage once again.

Personal Formula for Success

My philosophy is simple: hard work and trust in the process. Talent may provide a foundation, but discipline

and relentless effort script the story of success. I believe that every challenge is an opportunity to grow, and I have always pushed myself to be better than I was yesterday.

Message for Aspiring Women Achievers and Entrepreneurs

To every woman with a dream, remember: success isn't about where you begin, but about how fiercely you rise. Your journey is unique, and your strength is limitless. Success is not just about talent; it's about perseverance, discipline, and the courage to rise after every setback.

Challenges will come, but let them fuel your determination, not weaken your resolve. Believe in yourself, surround yourself with those who uplift you, and never stop striving for excellence. 

Coming from a modest background, he had a strong vision of creating high-quality sweets and farsans. His journey began with limited financial resources, initially working as a milk distributor to support his ambitions.

One of his biggest challenges in those early days was sourcing premium Mawa and Grade-A raw materials, along with finding skilled labor, as **Saroj Sweets was the first sweet shop in Chembur.** However, his dedication and unwavering determination allowed him to overcome these hurdles and turn his dream into reality.

The name **'Saroj'** is deeply personal-it was named after Manisha's my mother in-law, a tribute that gives the brand an intimate touch.

Looking back on my journey, I never set out to break barriers or prove a point—I simply wanted to do my best and contribute meaningfully to my family's business.

When I first stepped into Saroj Sweets in 1993, the industry was largely male-dominated, and it was uncom-

mon for women to take on leadership roles in business, especially in customer-facing or decision-making positions. I faced scepticism from those around mecustomers, suppliers, even my own team-because people weren't used to seeing a woman actively involved in running a sweet shop.

Despite the challenges, I stayed focused on what mattered: ensuring that the business thrived while maintaining the quality and reputation that my family had built. It took time to earn trust and respect, but gradually, through hard work and perseverance, the resistance began to fade. Today, I am grateful that my role is recognized not just within the company, but also by our suppliers, customers, and corporate partners.

Interestingly, my initial dream was to become an **IPS officer**-not for the title, but for the opportunity to bring positive change to society. While I eventually found myself in business instead, I have realized that many of the qualities required in law enforcement-discipline, crisis management, leadership, and the ability to connect with people-have played an equally crucial role in my entrepreneurial journey. In many ways, I feel I have fulfilled my purpose of making an impact, just in a different way than I had originally imagined.

I always believed that to run a successful business, you must see it from a customer's perspective, and that philosophy has guided every decision I've made.

My upbringing instilled in me the values of hard work and responsibility. Coming from a middle-class background, I saw my parents work tirelessly to support not just our immediate family but our extended family as well. That sense of duty and commitment shaped my approach to business.

I did not have formal education in management or marketing, but I relied on keen observation and realworld experience to navigate challenges. I always believed that to run a successful business, you must see it from a customer's perspective, and that philosophy has guided every decision I've made.

One of the biggest challenges in our industry is **consistency**, especially with staff turnover. Over the years, we have built a strong system-meticulously refining recipes, mentoring employees, and maintaining close relationships with suppliers-to ensure that every product meets our high standards. Our commitment to quality has remained unchanged for over 68 years. We have never used preservatives or artificial colors, relying only on

pure ingredients and natural saffron. Even during difficult times like the pandemic, when many businesses struggled, we held onto our core values, knowing that trust and quality are what keep our customers coming back.

Expanding beyond a single location was another turning point. To grow, we ventured into **institutional sales and corporate gifting**, partnering with organizations like **BARC, TISS, and HPCL.** This step allowed us to reach new markets, and today, Saroj Sweets is recognized not just locally but across India, including cities like Bangalore.

In the early days, navigating finances and external business relationships was another challenge. As a woman, I had to work harder to establish credibility with banks, suppliers, and corporate clients. There were moments when my opinions were dismissed, but I focused on results rather than seeking validation. Over time, my work spoke for itself, and today, I am consulted for business decisions and valued for my expertise.

Beyond business, I believe in using my platform to support other women. I understand how difficult it can be to step into a space traditionally led by men, and I want to - 66

encourage more women to pursue their dreams fearlessly. I have been involved in **women's empowerment initiatives**, offering mentorship, financial literacy workshops, and opportunities for women to achieve independence.



Life continued and the home front was managed with a support system of home aids and family. Children flew to pursue their own interests.

In the corporate world, especially in senior leadership roles, the demands only intensified. The very challenges that once excited me in the early years gradually began to feel overwhelming.

I am not sure, if it was age or the number of years of work or the constant balancing act that I did all along, but something hit me and I felt the need to put a stop to all of it. I quit the corporate world with no agenda in mind. I took a sabbatical for myself.

My plan was to do all that I missed out namely the reading, travelling, teaching, working on my fitness and watching some interesting movies. The next few years, I did work on my fitness regime, travelled few countries, spent quality time with family and caught up on reading.

My advice to all women working, self-employed or otherwise is this - the journey of life is bound to be uncertain and it will cause anxiety at times. You may not know the answer and you may get lost at times. You may not be a perfect mother, wife and daughter every time. And that is absolutely OK! You are human and have every right to fail.

Life was a steady boat and friends started reaching out from the industry seeking help in their business challenges and this picked up a little momentum, which led me to start **AdWISE ASSURE Pvt Ltd**, an insurance advisory firm.

However, there was this soft, inner voice nudging me to start 'touching lives' in a way that went beyond reasoning. Standing at the intersection of global finance, entrepreneurship, and gender equality, I founded Radically Yours as a knowledge-sharing platform that connects innovative businesses with institutional capital. With established chapters in Singapore, London, and India, my mission is to create pathways for women entrepreneurs in an industry where gender-based funding disparities remain stark.

As a UN Fellow and a speaker at prestigious institutions, I have dedicated my journey to addressing systemic challenges facing women in business. From my early days as a TEDx speaker at 21 to being recognized as one of Mumbai's most influential women leaders, my experiences have shaped my perspective on perseverance, strategic networking, and purpose-driven entrepreneurship.

Sources of Inspiration and Key Influences

My journey began at Narsee Monjee College of Commerce, where I completed my Bachelor of Management Studies. It was during this time that I first became aware of the gender disparities in entrepreneurial funding, and it profoundly shaped my mission.

I noticed a pattern early in my career: brilliant women entrepreneurs with viable business models were consistently overlooked by institutional investors, despite demonstrating stronger metrics than their male counterparts. This realization fueled my determination to create change.

I owe a great deal to the early mentors in the investment community who provided me with behind-the-scenes insights into funding decisions. These relationships helped me identify the specific pain points in the investor-entrepreneur dynamic that disproportionately affected women founders.

Career Milestones

My career has been a series of calculated steps toward expanding impact and addressing gender disparities in business. Some of the defining moments include:

 TEDx Speaker at 21 – My early foray into public speaking positioned me as an emerging voice in entrepreneurship.

- Podcast Development My show, Radically Yours by Radhika, has featured over 50 global women founders

and investors, documenting success stories and creating visibility for women breaking barriers.

- Global Expansion Launching chapters in Singapore and London demonstrated my understanding of global investment flows. The Singapore chapter, in particular, focuses on facilitating jobs and internships for women in the India-Singapore corridor while supporting fundraising efforts for women General Partners and founders.
- Recognition as a LinkedIn Influencer Being named among India's top 20 LinkedIn influencers has helped amplify my message and advocacy for gender equality.

Overcoming Challenges

Expanding Radically Yours beyond India required navigating different business cultures, regulatory environments, and established networks. I approached this challenge by identifying strategic partners in each target market who shared my vision for women's economic empowerment.

The successful launch of the Singapore and London chapters demonstrates my ability to translate this model across cultural contexts while maintaining a consistent mission.

Measuring Impact

A persistent challenge in advocacy work is demonstrating measurable impact. To address this, I implemented tracking mechanisms for key metrics:

- Number of successful funding rounds facilitated
- Job placements created through my network
- Partnership agreements between investors and women founders
- Media visibility for women entrepreneurs featured on my platform

This data-driven approach has strengthened my case when approaching institutional partners and expanding the reach of my initiatives.

Personal Formula for Success

My approach to professional development and leadership is rooted in several key principles:

- **1. Evidence-Based Advocacy** I ground my work in research and data rather than relying solely on personal experience.
- **2. Platform Diversification** By leveraging podcasts, speaking engagements, written content, and networking events, I ensure resilience in my outreach strategy.
- **3 Strategic Network Building** My global network of HNIs, family offices, venture capitalists, and investment

funds has been developed through intentional relationship-building.

- **4. Continuous Learning –** Despite early success, I remain committed to educational development, engaging with prestigious institutions and fellowships.
- **5. Mentorship Exchange** Rather than viewing mentorship as a one-way transaction, I have created systems for mutual knowledge sharing between established investors and emerging entrepreneurs.

Message for Aspiring Women Achievers

For women entering entrepreneurship or investment fields, my advice is straightforward:

- Document your achievements meticulously: Women tend to underreport their successes, which affects everything from funding applications to leadership opportunities.
- Develop expertise in specific vertical markets:
 Specialized knowledge creates inroads to otherwise closed networks.
- Financial literacy is essential: Understanding term sheets, valuation methods, and funding instruments isn't optional-it's crucial for engaging investors as equals.
- **Support other women:** The W.I.P.E initiative exemplifies this by creating structured opportunities for collaboration rather than competition.

Gender Equality in Economic Development

My perspective on gender equality goes beyond social justice arguments - I see it as an economic imperative.

Through my podcast and speaking engagements, I highlight research that demonstrates the economic value of women's participation.

The funding gap isn't just unfair - it's inefficient. When women-led businesses generate significantly higher revenue per dollar of funding, restricting their access to capital represents a market failure.

My approach to economic development emphasizes:

1. Access to Capital – Creating direct pathways between

women entrepreneurs and funding sources.

- **2. Skills Development** Providing technical and soft skills training for women in high-growth sectors.
- **3. Network Access** Opening previously closed networks to qualified women professionals.
- **4. Policy Advocacy** Engaging with regulatory bodies to address structural barriers.

y entrepreneurial journey is not merely about business achievements; it is a profound tale of overcoming immense personal loss, embracing change, and channelling the pain of the past into a force for innovation. It is a story fuelled by a deep love for my family, a strong desire to give back to my community, and an unwavering passion to create something meaningful. From this journey, I birthed two unique businesses: **Choco Galleria** and **Wahi Dahi**.

The Calm before the Storm

Before 2015, my life seemed perfect - stable, content, and full of promise. Living in Jamaica with my husband and children, I had established myself as a successful catering service provider, a role that allowed me to combine my love for food with my natural talent for service. Alongside my work, I was deeply involved in social causes, giving back to the community that had supported me. My life felt secure and fulfilling, with a bright future ahead.

However, life often has a way of throwing us unexpected challenges. In 2015, while on vacation in India with my family, tragedy struck. I lost my husband suddenly, a devastating blow that left me grappling with grief. The life I had known came to a standstill, and everything that

once felt secure became uncertain. My plans were shattered, and I was forced to confront an entirely new reality.

In the aftermath of this profound loss, I was unable to return to Jamaica and continue the life I had so carefully built. Faced with overwhelming sorrow and uncertainty, I made the difficult decision to donate everything I had to the Army Salvation and the National Children's Home. It was a necessary step, but one born out of deep compassion, signalling the end of a chapter in my life that I could

not hold on to any longer.

The Birth of Choco Galleria

With no prior business experience and a future clouded by uncertainty, I faced a difficult choice: start a new venture or remain uncertain. The idea of running a business wasn't something I had considered before, but the need to secure my children's future and create a stable life made entrepreneurship a necessity.

In 2015, the concept of a chocolate showroom in Bhubaneswar was an unheard-of idea. There were no boutiques offering high-quality, chemical-free chocolates, and this gap in the market became an opportunity. Driven by my husband's last wish and a desire to create something fresh and innovative, I took a bold leap and decided to open **Choco Galleria**, a specialized chocolate store in Bhubaneswar.

Choco Galleria was more than just a chocolate store; it was a vision that I wanted to bring to life. My goal was to provide customers with the best chocolates, made from pure, chemical-free ingredients. In a world dominated by mass-produced chocolates, I envisioned a space where people could indulge in authentic, handcrafted choco-

lates that were healthy and delicious.

The journey wasn't easy, especially in the early days. With the pressure of raising my children while starting from scratch, I poured my heart into building this business. I sourced the finest ingredients, honed my recipes, and made sure each chocolate piece was a work of art. Over time, Choco Galleria gained the trust of the people of Bhubaneswar, earning a reputation for its authenticity and commitment to quality.

My hard work paid off. Choco Galleria became recog-

nized for its creativity and dedication to excellence. People who had never experienced handcrafted chocolates were discovering new Flavors and textures, and the business continued to grow, proudly representing purity and craftsmanship.

Navigating the Storm: Overcoming COVID-19

In any entrepreneurial journey, setbacks are inevitable, and for me, the next major challenge was the global pandemic - COVID-19. Like countless businesses worldwide, Choco Galleria faced enormous hurdles during the lockdowns, market disruptions, and changing consumer behaviour. Yet, I refused to let this crisis define me.

Instead of succumbing to the pressures of the pandemic, I saw it as an opportunity to innovate. I recognized that the business landscape was shifting, and relying solely on chocolate sales would no longer suffice. This realization sparked the birth of **Wahi Dahi**.

The Birth of Wahi Dahi: Oven-Baked Sweet Curd

In 2019, I took a bold step into an uncharted territory by experimenting with something entirely new - oven-baked sweet curd (Dahi). I created five earthen pots of Dahi as Diwali gifts for my corporate clients, unaware that this small act would change the trajectory of my entrepreneurial path.

The response to the Dahi was overwhelming. People loved the distinct taste and the traditional touch of being presented in earthen pots. Encouraged by this success, I

decided to explore the idea further. In 2020, I launched **Wahi Dahi** at the MSME Trade Fair, and the public's response was extraordinary.

Wahi Dahi was not just another food product; it was an experience. The process of baking curd in earthen pots ensured a unique flavour, while also extending the shelf life without the need for preservatives. As the water content evaporated during the baking process, the curd absorbed the natural elements from the pots, resulting in a rich, delicious taste, free from chemicals and harmful bacteria.

As the first product of its kind in Odisha, Wahi Dahi quickly gained popularity and received recognition from food critics and influential figures, including the former Chief Minister and Governor, who became loyal fans. Its unique flavors, from saffron to pina colada, and the ability to customize earthen pots for special occasions, set Wahi Dahi apart from other offerings in the market.

As demand for Wahi Dahi skyrocketed, I opened the firstever Wahi Dahi outlet in Odisha-a milestone that signalled a new chapter in my entrepreneurial journey. Through my passion, resilience, and commitment to quality, I had created not one, but two successful businesses that were now cherished by the people of Bhubaneswar and beyond.

A Labor of Love and Strength

Both Choco Galleria and Wahi Dahi are more than businesses to me; they are labours of love. They are my way of honouring my late husband's wishes, providing for my children, and contributing something truly unique to our community. Every flavour, every presentation, and every concept behind these ventures is a reflection of my journey - one of perseverance, passion, and determination.

Despite the unimaginable personal loss, I channelled my grief into something positive. I used my love for innovation and my desire to provide for my family as the driving forces behind my success. This journey has been a reminder that anything is possible when you have the will to succeed, the love to push you forward, and the adaptability to innovate in the face of adversity.

Where there is a will, there is a way. The journey continues, and there is still much more to come.

always had a strong academic inclination and
consistently excelled in my studies. I ranked among the
All India Top-10 at all three levels of the rigorous
Chartered Accountancy examination and also secured
the top position at Pune University in my Commerce
graduation.

I was thriving in a high-flying banking career when the birth of my daughter became a major turning point in my life. With the need to spend more time at home, I began exploring alternative career paths beyond the conventional corporate trajectory.

Back in 2007, Chartered Accountants in Pune were primarily engaged in either **service roles (jobs) or practice (audits and taxation).** However, my husband and I wanted to take a different route. Instead of following the traditional paths, we decided to establish a **boutique Investment Banking firm**,

From 2007 to 2009, we took on every small job that came our way, gradually finding our niche in the **Real Estate sector**. We chose this industry as it was gaining significant interest from new-age financial institutions, while many builders and real estate developers remained

unaware of the evolving financing options available to them.

What made this sector particularly promising was that each client typically had multiple fundable projects, and each project could secure funding at various stages of its life cycle. This allowed us to tap into an unmet customer need while also building a financially rewarding business model. We achieved a reasonable level of success while staying attuned to shifts in both the competitive land-scape and economic environment.

Post-Covid, we expanded our focus to include financial consulting and fundraising for startups. By late 2023, we further diversified into M&A deal-making and advisory, broadening our expertise. Today, our firm operates with three Directors, each leading a specialized vertical-Real Estate, Early-Stage Startups, and M&A-ensuring focused growth and strategic execution across these domains.

Family, Work, and the Art of Making It Work: As a mother of two daughters, one of whom requires special attention, balancing the demands of both home and work has been anything but easy. I firmly believe that the idea of "having it all" is a myth. Being a mother and an entrepreneur are both full-time roles, each requiring immense dedication. The reality is that compromises are inevitable, and once you accept this, it becomes easier to set realistic expectations and make decisions based on the circumstances at hand.

There have been countless instances where I found myself stretched thin, forced to choose between attending a crucial business meeting or staying home to care for a sick child-along with the many other familial responsibilities that we, as Indian women, often juggle. However, I have learned that with effective time management, a reliable and efficient support system-both at work and at home-and understanding partners in both spheres, everything eventually falls into place. The key is to prioritize wisely, delegate when necessary, and embrace the journey with resilience and grace.

A message for aspiring women achievers and entrepreneurs: I have increasingly observed that many women entrepreneurs excel in managing operations and business development but often overlook the financial aspects of their business. In most cases, financial management is delegated to a partner or a family member.

Finance is the lifeblood of an organization, and it's crucial for every entrepreneur to have an understanding of financial fundamentals. Being able to read, interpret, and analyze financial statements empowers business owners to make informed decisions that drive growth and sustainability.

Being able to read, interpret, and analyze financial statements empowers business owners to make informed decisions that drive growth and sustainability. Developing financial acumen not only helps in achieving business goals and ensuring financial independence but also significantly boosts confidence in navigating the entrepreneurial journey.

I recall working with a woman entrepreneur from Pune who had been successfully managing her MSME unit for over three decades. A seasoned business leader, she had recently expanded into a new vertical by acquiring another unit. However, she soon found herself at a crossroads, struggling to determine how to generate a reasonable return on her capital investment in the new venture

Through a series of informal discussions, we delved into both her existing and new businesses, analyzing key metrics and growth prospects. The information itself wasn't unfamiliar to her, but my role was to help her view it through a more structured and strategic lens.

Once she gained clarity on how the financials of her two revenue streams would function-considering factors such as working capital requirements and the conversion cycle-she was able to develop a well-defined target plan for the year. This newfound perspective enabled her to make informed decisions, setting her on a clear path toward optimizing her investment and ensuring sustainable growth.

My Personal Formula for Success: I firmly believe in the saying, "The devil is in the details." Whether it's a small initiative or a large-scale project, success largely depends on meticulous planning and efficient execution. In today's VUCA (Volatile, Uncertain, Complex, and Ambiguous) world, where the environment is constantly evolving, it is impossible to predict every challenge that may arise.

However, being well-prepared from the outset makes it easier to adapt to changes. **Planning enhances agility.** For instance, every weekend, I plan my family's meals and weekly schedule in advance. This ensures that, during the week, I can focus more on my work commitments without constantly managing household responsibilities. Of course, unforeseen situations may arise, but addressing occasional disruptions is far easier than dealing with unplanned tasks every single day.

The same principle applies to business. At any given time, we are managing multiple deals and consultancy assignments in parallel. By maintaining deal-wise progress sheets, implementing structured activity-based planning, and ensuring regular communication and feedback, we make certain that every project receives the attention it deserves. This organized approach not only streamlines operations but also helps us consistently exceed client expectations.

Paying It Forward: As a parting thought, I encourage all readers to embrace the philosophy of "**Paying it Forward.**" Throughout our entrepreneurial journey, we receive immense support-be it in the form of advice, mentorship, funding, valuable connections, or even encouragement from family, friends, and colleagues.

It is essential to reflect on how we can give back and extend the same support to others. Giving back does not always have to be monetary, such as donations, employee welfare, or startup funding. It can also take the form of mentorship, knowledge-sharing, skill-building, or even a simple act of connecting someone with the right people. Whether it's guiding an employee with a startup idea, training aspiring professionals, or supporting a colleague through networking, every small effort counts.

y Inspiration, key life events, and influential people in my journey:

I come from a family of strong-willed and creative minds, and my biggest inspiration has always been my family-especially the five most important women in my life: my mother, Pearl Padamsee; my other mother, Rose; my closest aunt, Dr. Julie Nathwani & Sabira Merchant; and the strongest of them all, Dr. Mithu Alur. Theatre has been my passion for as long as I can remember. I started my journey at 18 at Kulsum Terrace, and all these years later, I'm still here, still driven by the same excitement to create something magical. That passion led me to start ACE Productions, and over the years, we've staged some incredible musicals like 'The Sound of Music', 'My Fair Lady', 'Grease', and many more.

I've always wanted to do things differently- to push boundaries and bring fresh ideas to the stage. Inclusivity has been close to my heart, which is why I started 'Create Foundation' in memory of my mother. Through this initiative, children from different NGOs get the same opportunities to perform in our productions as anyone else. Seeing them shine on stage is one of the most fulfilling parts of my work.

One of our most special productions, 'Mahatma – Come Find the Gandhi in You', was recognized by Amitabh Bachchan, Sachin Tendulkar, Alia Bhatt, and the late Om Puri. The Governor of Maharashtra, C. Vidyasagar Rao, was so moved by the effort that he invited 300 children to celebrate at the Governor's Bungalow. Another proud moment was 'Rediscover the Epic', a modern retelling of the Ramayana featuring 150 children and young adults from seven NGOs, which received appreciation from Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis and his wife, Amruta Fadnavis, for its message of diversity and inclusion.

Victoria Krane, President of the Lee Strasberg Theatre and Film Institute (New York), recognized our efforts in making theatre more inclusive, and I've been lucky to have the support of some incredible people along the way-Sunil Shetty, Boman Irani, Juhi Chawla, Raveena Tandon, Cyrus Broacha, and Kunal Vijayakar, to name a few. Their belief in what we do has meant the world to me

Major milestones: One of the biggest milestones in my career was producing 'Broken Images', a play that brought together three incredible Padma awardees - Padma Bhushan Girish Karnad, who wrote the play; Padma Bhushan Shabana Azmi, whose performance remains nothing short of phenomenal; and my father, Padma Shri Alyque Padamsee, who directed it. The fact that 'Broken Images' has completed over 100 shows and still plays to packed houses is something I hold very close to my heart.

Another moment of realization came when I was compiling productions for my website and saw, in front of me, the sheer volume of work we had done - over 75 plays in 40 years. It wasn't something I had consciously kept track of, but seeing it all come together was a humbling and proud moment. Additionally, we perform over 700 plays a year with our 15,000 students!

Along with our shows, ACE also runs Speech & Drama courses in 25+ schools-a journey that began on a small scale at Kulsum Terrace and gradually expanded to nearby areas. Today, we are proud to be present in schools across South Mumbai, Thane, and Borivali, impacting the lives of over 15,000 students each year and contributing to their holistic development.

Having said that, Theatre productions come with their fair share of challenges-tight deadlines, unpredictable

obstacles, and the pressure to make every show a success. But at the end of the day, it all boils down to staying focused on the goal and making it happen, no matter what. As the famous saying goes, "The show must go on," and that's exactly what we live by in this industry. There have been crazy, chaotic moments, but the passion for storytelling and the love for the stage make it all worth it.

My personal formula for success: I don't take no for an answer - whether it's from myself or my team. I have always believed that there is a way to make things happen if you're determined enough. Challenges will come, but they're just problems waiting for solutions. Our real work begins when the opportunity says 'no'.

One thing that really helps me is planning. Instead of getting overwhelmed by where to start, I first picture what the final outcome should be. Once that's clear, we break it down step by step, setting deadlines along the way to make sure we're always moving forward. Additionally, planning a WDW (Who is Doing What) and understanding Why We Do What We Do is a crucial step. It keeps us focused, accountable, and, most importantly, ensures that we reach our goal on time.

But beyond strategies and planning, success is about having the drive to keep going, the flexibility to adapt, and the confidence to take bold steps - even when the odds are stacked against you.

A message for aspiring women achievers and entrepreneurs

Don't let a "no" stop you. If Plan A doesn't work, remember there are 25 more letters in the alphabet - keep trying until you find the one that does.

The road to success isn't always smooth, and there will be moments of doubt, failure, and frustration. But what truly defines you is how you push through those moments. By 2021, I was conducting 20-minute power conversations with business owners, helping them gain insight into their businesses. Knowing that my work was creating an impact on India's economy and beyond reinforced that I had truly "made it" in my home country—helping businesses thrive and transform.

Our efforts have been recognized with several accolades, including runner-up positions in **The Business Diva 2024** and **Ms. Yashaswini 2024**, along with the **Womannovator Award 2024**.

From Mexico to Global Markets: How I Found My Purpose

I was born in Mexico, where I witnessed firsthand the challenges women face in pursuing economic independence. These early experiences were formative in shaping the person I would become. My mom, a courageous and resourceful woman, was my first and most profound source of inspiration. Her resilience in the face of adversity taught me that financial independence is not just about money-it's about freedom, dignity, and the ability to make choices.

One memory stands out vividly. My mom was trapped in an abusive situation with limited options for escape. But rather than accepting her fate, she devised a plan. She organized what I believe was Mexico's first-ever yard sale, selling off our belongings to raise the funds she needed to start a new life for us. This act of bravery was not just an escape-it was a declaration of her ability to shape her own future.

Witnessing her strength made me realize how transformative entrepreneurship can be for anyone seeking power and control over their life and the lives of other family members.

That early lesson stayed with me as I pursued my education and began to carve out my own path. I

eventually earned a Master of Arts in Law and Diplomacy from the Fletcher School at Tufts University. While my studies focused on international development, I was also deeply interested in understanding how global systems could either empower or exclude people-especially women.

Education was not just a means to an end; it was a tool to help me understand how power works and to find solutions to some of the world's most pressing problems.

Discovering My Purpose: Connecting Women to Global Markets

My introduction to the world of women entrepreneurs came early in my career when I helped to organize the first Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development or OECD Conference on Women's Entrepreneurship. I was struck by how many brilliant, innovative women were building companies, delivering solutions, creating jobs and helping their families and communities. Despite having incredible products and services, they were invisible in our global value chains.

It became clear to me that the problem wasn't a lack of talent or ambition-it was a lack of access-access to market knowledge and networks. Women-owned businesses deserved a seat at the table, and I wanted to help.

This realization led me to co-found **WEConnect** International, a corporate-led global non-profit dedicated to connecting women-owned businesses with very large member buyers. What began as a vision to level the playing field has grown into a global movement.

Today, we work with **180+ multinational corporations** with over **\$4 trillion** in annual purchasing power and a

commitment to buy more from women-owned businesses that are ready to compete and win in 135+ countries.

One of the most rewarding aspects of this work is seeing the tangible impact it has on women's lives. I remember meeting a woman in India who ran a successful logistics company. Despite her expertise, she struggled to secure major contracts. After joining WEConnect International, she landed a deal with a member buyers that transformed her business and allowed her to hire more people in her community. Stories like hers fuel my commitment to this mission-they are proof that when women succeed, everyone benefits.

The Power of Collaboration and Lifelong Mentors

I know that no one achieves success alone. Throughout my journey, I've had the privilege of working with and learning from remarkable individuals who have shaped my approach to leadership.

One of the most important lessons I've learned is the value of building strong partnerships. The most successful entrepreneurs and leaders don't work in isolation-they surround themselves with people who bring different skills and perspectives to the table.

I've learned that to drive real change, you must be both persistent and adaptable.

Early in my career, I was fortunate to be mentored by leaders who understood the importance of paying it forward. These mentors not only shared their knowledge, but also encouraged me to trust my instincts and take calculated risks. Their belief in me gave me the confidence to push boundaries and challenge the systems that keep all of us from benefiting from the products and services women have to offer.

One of my most significant professional milestones came when the founding members of **WEConnect International** asked me to incorporate the organization because at the time they did not have access to a global database of Certified Women-Owned Businesses. The Certification Standard was set by the Women's Business



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Enterprise National Council (WBENC) focused on the United States, and so we adopted it as the Universal Global Certification Standard.

Our Founding Member Buyers created us to open doors for women-owned businesses to compete and help build more innovative, resilient supply chains while also delivering social impact at scale. We started in the United Kingdom, and then Canada, and then India and China, and then Latin America and Africa, and today we are serving women-owned businesses based in over 135 countries.

Overcoming Challenges and Staying the Course

Building a global organization has been a very steep learning curve. Some of the biggest hurdles have been navigating different regulatory landscapes, entrepreneurial ecosystems and different cultures. In some regions, it is very difficult for women to start and grow a business, and globally women still earn only 1% of corporate and government spend on products and services.

I've learned that to drive real change, you must be both persistent and adaptable. There have been many moments when the path forward was unclear-when it seemed easier to accept the status quo. But I've always believed that the work we do is too important to stop.

While the progress can feel painfully slow at times, every

breakthrough-every woman who secures a new contract or scales her business-reaffirms that change is possible. Each challenge we face only strengthens my resolve to keep pushing for a world where everyone can contribute and benefit.

My Formula for Success

If I had to distill my approach to success into a few key principles, it would be this:

- **1. Collaboration Over Competition** The most impactful solutions come from working together. I believe in building ecosystems and fostering environments where each perspective is valued and leveraged.
- **2. Resilience and Adaptability** Challenges are inevitable, but how you respond to them defines your path. Zero in on what you can control, be willing to pivot, learn from setbacks, and stay focused on your long-term vision.
- **3. Lifelong Learning** The world is constantly evolving, and staying curious is essential. Seek out new knowledge, listen to those with different experiences, and never stop growing.

4. Purpose-Driven Leadership – At the heart of everything I do is a commitment to moving large amounts of money into the hands of women as fast as possible because of the way they spend it on everyone around them. Having a clear purpose keeps me grounded and motivated, even during tough times.

But beyond the numbers, there is a moral imperative to ensure that everyone has the opportunity to reach their full potential. We cannot afford to leave half the population behind. When we break down the barriers holding women back, we all move forward.

As I reflect on my journey-from a young girl in Mexico watching her mother reclaim her independence to leading a global movement to make procurement systems work for everyone-I feel a profound sense of gratitude. The work is far from finished. But I remain hopeful and committed to practical steps we can all take towards impact - by purchasing with purpose - one connection at a time.
