

Over 32 countries and 150 Exhibitors at World Trade Center Mumbai for the 6th World Trade Expo to accelerate global trade

MUMBAI: The 6th World Trade Expo, organised by the All India Association of Industries (AIAI) and MVIRDC World Trade Centre Mumbai, opened in Mumbai with a strong call for deeper international cooperation, sustainable trade partnerships, and accelerated economic growth. The two-day event brings together trade missions, diplomats, MSMEs, state agencies and industry leaders from more than 32 countries, making it one of India's most globally diverse trade platforms this year.

Inaugurating the expo, Ms. Pankaja Munde, Maharashtra's Minister for Environment and Climate Change, said the event would play a pivotal role in strengthening India's ties with Africa, Latin America, the ASEAN region, Europe and the United States. She noted that the Expo's cross-border discussions and collaborations would support India's ambition of becoming a USD 5 trillion economy and help Maharashtra achieve its USD 1 trillion economic goal by 2027.

"This significant platform for partnership and collaboration will deepen our trade relations and

open new avenues for developing countries," she said.

She added that the Expo would bring together international trade missions, foreign delegates, Indian MSMEs, and government officials to foster technology transfer, joint ventures, and enhanced import-export opportunities from Maharashtra.

Mr. Mangal Prabhat Lodha, Minister for Skill, Employment, Entrepreneurship and Innovation, highlighted the government's focus on building a globally competitive workforce. "We expect exports to create meaningful and sustainable partnerships that strengthen knowledge exchange and global trade connectivity," he said. He noted that Maharashtra has several skilling schemes and is keen to collaborate with the private sector to boost entrepreneurship and supply skilled talent to global markets.

Mr. Ameet Satam, Mumbai BJP Chief, emphasised Maharashtra's commitment to attracting investment through streamlined approvals and investor support. "The state has laid out a red carpet for international investors. Mumbai, as India's economic capital, remains the ideal

destination for global business," he said.

The Expo also underscored its focus on MSMEs, women entrepreneurs and start-ups—sectors seen as vital for India's global trade expansion. Dr. Vijay Kalantri, Chairman of WTC Mumbai and President of AIAI, said the Expo aims to empower these segments through international collaborations.

"We expect over 6,000 business visitors and more than 5,000 B2B meetings," he said, noting the growing interest from untapped markets such as Africa, CIS nations, Australia and Latin America. Dr. Kalantri stressed the importance of improving connectivity, enhancing communication and settling trade in local currencies to reduce costs and ease business operations.

He added that participating countries at this year's Expo represent significant yet underexplored business opportunities, reflecting strong confidence in India's rising influence in the global economic order.

Ms. Priya Pansare, Director of Trade and Investment Promotion, said the World Trade Expo continues to serve as a key hub for diplomatic
